Topic Overview		English	
<p>This term... At the start of the term, the children will receive some post from Percy the Park Keeper. He will ask the children to discover things about Autumn and about all of the exciting festivals and celebrations this term.</p>		<p>As Language Specialists, we will read a variety of stories, information texts and poetry. As writers, we will continue to develop our handwriting whilst we write sentences, speech bubbles, letters, stories, recipes, information texts and poems. As readers, we will continue to share stories through listening, role play and listening to and discussing a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction at a level beyond that at which they can read independently.</p>

<p>As mathematicians, we will count on, back, and order numbers to 10. We will identify one more, one less, ten more and ten less using a number grid. We will solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations. We will look at number bonds to 10 and number fact families.</p>		<p>As scientists, we will be looking at the season of Autumn across the curriculum. We will also be identifying and classifying different types of animals, in order to help Percy in his park.</p>
